Eco-Friendly Toys – Choosing toys that are non-toxic, age and safety appropriate, and reduce environmental impacts are good for both the environment and our children. Look for solid wood toys or items made from felt, cotton or wool. If you do choose a wooden toy, look for something with a non-toxic finish. If you decide to bring home a plastic toy, avoid BPA and PVC at all costs. This is particularly true if you think the child will put the toy in his or her mouth. Instead, look for plastics #1, 2, 4 or 5 as they are safer; you should be able to find what kind of plastic the toy was made with by looking at the bottom of the packaging.
