Permission to Apply Topical Products – Sunscreen, insect repellent, diaper rash products, lotion, or other topical products to be applied at Annsworth require a form, one for each product, completed and signed by a parent. Details regarding application are on the permission form. The form is available on our website, or you may request a copy by email or at Annsworth in person.

Annsworth staff will apply the sunscreen and/or insect repellent to exposed skin, just prior to <u>afternoon</u> playground time. It is recommended that parents apply each morning before school to protect the child during the morning playground times. Sunscreen should be broad-spectrum with UVB and UVA protection of SPF 15 or higher. Due to NAEYC recommendations, Annsworth will not use products that combine sunscreen and insect repellent. Additionally, all products must be <u>non-aerosol</u>. Please check that the product you supply has not expired.

Bike Days – Our Pre-K classes have scheduled a BIKE DAY this month for our Transportation unit. We will flag off the entrance/exit of the circular drive and the children will be allowed to ride their vehicles around the circle during their morning playground time. Please bring a TRIKE or BIKE your child feels safe and comfortable riding. DO NOT send a brand-new bike that your child is not familiar with. We require safety gear, so please provide a BIKE HELMET that fits your child. Please be sure the bike is in good working order and all bolts are tightened and secure. Label both the bike and helmet with your child's name. For helmets and bikes that have action figures on them, please cover the figures with tape. Also, remember to pick up your child's bike at the end of the day. Room 10 will have Bike Day on Tuesday, April 3rd and Room 9 will have Bike Day on Thursday, April 5th.

Florida Department of Children and Families Facts About Heatstroke – It only takes a car 10 minutes to heat up 20 degrees and become deadly. Even with a window cracked, the temperature inside a vehicle can cause heatstroke. The body temperature of a child increases 3 to 5 times faster than an adult's body. Heatstroke Prevention Tips:

- Never leave your child alone in a car and call 911 if you see any child locked in a car.
- Make a habit of checking the front and back seat of the car before you walk away.
- o Be especially mindful during hectic or busy times, schedule or route changes, and periods of emotional stress or chaos.
- Create reminders by putting something in the back seat that you will need at work, school, or home such as a briefcase, purse, cell phone, or your left shoe.
- Keep a stuffed animal in the child's car seat and place it on the front seat as a reminder when the child is in the back seat.
- Set a calendar reminder on your electronic device to make sure you dropped your child off at childcare.
- Make it a routine to always notify your child's childcare provider in advance if your child is going to be late or absent; ask them to contact you if your child has not arrived as scheduled.
